



PARADE RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All parade units must clearly display their assigned unit number.
2. Units must stay in their assigned order, unless specifically directed otherwise by a parade official. Please do not request to be moved on Parade Day.
3. All units will be limited to no more than 3 vehicles. Political Candidates are restricted to one vehicle.
 - a. Car clubs, motorcycle clubs, etc. are limited to no more than 8 vehicles. If more than 8 vehicles attend only the first 8 will be allowed to enter the parade route.
4. Vehicles must follow a straight course in a cautious and safe manner. There shall be no quick starts, stops or peeling of rubber. No swerving back and forth and no reckless driving of any kind.
5. No person shall ride on hood, roof, trunk, or doorframes of vehicles.
6. Persons who are walking should hand items that have been approved for distribution, to spectators. Persons distributing such materials must walk alongside their own unit and not intrude upon other unit's activities or presentation space. Units distributing materials (i.e. candy, brochures) must walk all the way to the curb to hand out materials.
7. There shall be no throwing of any type of item from vehicles to spectators.
8. No jumping on or off of vehicles.
9. Any unit, which has music (live or recorded) must set the volume at a reasonable level so they do not intrude on other unit's presentation space. Any parade official may request the volume to be lowered if they deem it too loud.
10. All elected officials with a political affiliation (Democrat, Republican) will be considered as one unit. No more than 3 vehicles will be allowed.
11. All units should leave appropriate space between themselves and the next unit (2 car lengths), neither should spacing be too large (over 3 car lengths).
12. Parades are forward moving. Please do not stop your unit for any type of performance.

13. Parade units must proceed past the end of the parade route before stopping and unloading
14. Anyone with alcohol at the parade staging area will have his or her entire unit removed from the lineup immediately.
15. Any unit, whose participants, argue with, use foul language or refuse to do what a parade official asks, will be removed from the lineup immediately.
16. Traffic citations may be issued by the Aurora Police Department for violation of any municipal ordinance or State vehicle code.
17. The City of Aurora reserves the right to deny approval of acceptance into the parade line up for units which have previously violated these regulations.
18. The Mayor's Office of Special Events staff has the right to make modifications to any rules and regulations, as they deem necessary for the safety and viewing enjoyment of the spectators.
19. The Mayor's Office of Special Events staff has the right to remove any units, day of parade, who are in violation of any of the above parade rules and regulations.
20. There is no paper handouts allowed by any unit in the parade. This is in line with our "Going Green" Initiative.
